Russia

- 1. The International Division of the Attorney General's Chambers advises that nine (9) entries have been added under the Russia Sanctions Regime¹ and is subject to an asset freeze, and trust services sanctions.
- Additionally, one hundred and one (101) ships have been added to the Regime.
